

FUNERAL SERVICES OF
APOSTLE FRANCES M. LYMAN.

The funeral services of Apostle Francis M. Lyman were held in the Tabernacle in Salt Lake City Tuesday. President Joseph F. Smith presiding. The proceedings being reported in all the Salt Lake papers.

On Wednesday the body was brought to Tooele by a special train of five cars, accompanied by members of the Council of the Twelve, the Seven Presidents of Seventies, the members of his family, and a large number of Apostle Lyman's friends.

In the Tooele South ward meeting house a short service was held, presided over by Apostle Heber J. Grant.

The Tooele choir sang an anthem, and prayer was offered by Semour B. Young of the Seventies.

Willard Weihe, accompanied by Prof. J. J. McClellan, rendered a violin solo.

The speakers were Apostle Rudger Clawson, Stake President, C. Alvin Orme, Apostle Joseph F. Smith, Jr., and B. H. Roberts of the Seventies. Who all had been co-workers with Apostle Lyman and personally knew of the great worth and labors performed by their departed leader and friend.

During the services Prof. Anthon C. Lund, leader of the Tabernacle choir, sang a solo.

The Tooele choir sang an anthem, and the benediction was by Joseph W. McMurrin of the Seventies.

After the services the casket containing the body was taken to the Tooele cemetery where it was interred in the family plot. The grave being dedicated by Presiding Patriarch Hyrum G. Smith. A violin solo by Prof. Weihe and a vocal solo by Prof. Lund was rendered at the grave.

The tribute of floral offerings brought from Salt Lake City with the body was so great that a special conveyance was used to transport them to the cemetery.

The meeting house was crowded to overflowing, representatives from all the wards in the stake being present.
