

# Lyman Clark Dies In Veteran's Hospital

Funeral Services To Be Held Sunday Afternoon In East Ward Chapel

Word was received here on Thursday morning that Lyman Phelps Clark, 40, world war veteran and member of the local post of the American Legion had passed away at 9:15 the evening before at the Veteran's hospital in Salt Lake City. Death was not unexpected as, Mr. Clark has been in poor health for a number of years and since he went to the hospital the last time, about three and a half months ago, it has been known that he wouldn't recover.

A telegram from the hospital a few days ago summoned his wife to his bed side and members of the family understood then that he couldn't live more than a few days.

The body was brought home Friday morning and the funeral is to be held Sunday afternoon at the East ward chapel.

The deceased was born in this city forty years ago, the son of Porter Vander and Laura Lyman Clark. He volunteered for service in the World war and served in the Forty-second infantry, company G, coast guard. He was assistant postmaster here for some time before he was compelled to give up his work and go to the hospital.

Surviving him are his widow, Violet Rasmussen Clark, six minor children, Sheldon, Doyle, Delmartin, Gene, Irsé and Delrea, his mother and the following brothers and sisters: Porter Amasa and Roswell Clark of Parowan, Wells Clark of Southern California, Nellie C. Dalton of Cowley, Wyoming and Lelia C. Nelson of Cedar City.
